Pick up the pichkari lets see you spray, chalo chalo chalo Rang Barse.



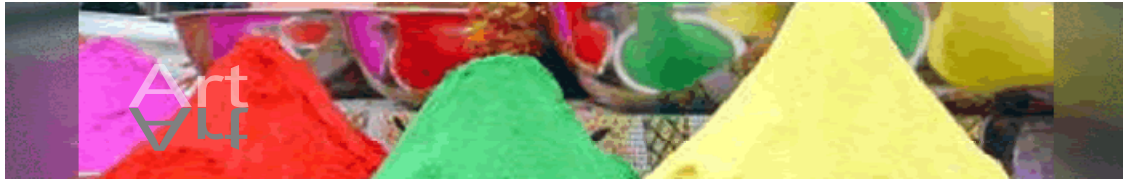
